

Grand Junction, Colorado, February 6, 1912.

Regular
meeting

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall.

The Mayor being absent, the Clerk called the meeting to order, and on motion of Commissioner Holmberg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, Commissioner Vorbeck was chosen president pro. tem.

Roll call

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Vorbeck, Rankin, Holmberg. Absent: Commissioners Todd and Vedder. A quorum being present, the Council proceeded to business.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

Minutes

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 30th were read and approved.

Communication read.

A communication from Frank Thompson, submitting a proposition to take the census of the city for \$100⁰⁰, was read.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmberg,

Said on the communication was laid on the table

Communication Referred. A communication from the Grand Junction Electric, Gas & Mfg Co, in reference to claim of \$114.79 for moving trolley poles, was read. On motion of Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin the communication was referred to the Mayor and the Commissioner of Highways.

Petition for Sidewalk Fifth St. The petition of John Edwards, John M. Phillips and others, asking that a sidewalk be ordered laid along the east side of Fifth street from Struthers avenue, 1272 feet to the property line of the D. & R. G. R. R., was presented and read.

Motion Moved by Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the petition be granted, and that the following resolution be passed and adopted:

Whereas, there are a number of houses along the east side of 5th street between Struthers' avenue and the property of the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company, and

Whereas, a number of the owners of said houses have petitioned the City Council of the City of Grand Junction to order the construction of sidewalk along east side of said street as heretofore limited, and

Whereas, in the opinion of the City Council, said sidewalk is a necessity;

Therefore be it Resolved, that the City Council of said city does hereby order the construction of the said sidewalk according to the ordinances in such cases made and provided, and the Clerk of said city is hereby authorized and instructed to notify the owners of the property fronting on the east side of said street as heretofore limited, to construct a cement sidewalk in front of their respective premises within thirty days after the receipt of said notice.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.
