The proof of publication of a <sup>proposed</sup> ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Amending Section 1 of Ordinance Number 185, entitled, 'An Ordinance Concerning Salaries of City Officers and Employes, and Fixing <sup>the</sup> Amount of Bond to be Given by Each Officer and Employe,'" passed and adopted the 17<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1911, was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proof of publication as read be accepted and placed on file. The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the proposed ordinance was then taken up for final passage, and read by the Clerk:
