

Grand Junction, Colorado, March 12th, 1912.

Regular meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll Call The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Rankin, Holmberg.

Acting City Attorney Tupper was present.

Minutes approved. The minutes of the regular meeting of March 5th were read and approved.

A communication from C. M. Miller, asking refund of money paid for expressman's license on account of having discontinued the business, was read.

Motion carried Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the City Treasurer be instructed to refund to C. M. Miller the sum of \$7.50, the amount paid by him for express license for six months, upon the return of license and license plate.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioner voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and it was so ordered.

Report of City Weigher accepted The report of the City Weigher for the month of February having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Com-

missioner Kolmburg, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The quarterly reports of the City Treasurer, the Judge of the Municipal Court, and the Commissioner of Water and Sewers, having been examined and found correct by the auditor, the same were, on motion of Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The bill of W. A. Lynch for \$110⁰⁰ for police services, having been approved by the Commissioner of Public Affairs, it was moved by Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the said bill be allowed and a warrant drawn for the amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bill allowed.

Mr. Bndeliev and a committee of ladies from the Woman's Home Protection League appeared before the Council and asked that an ordinance be passed requiring all billiard and pool halls to remove screens, etc., obstructing the view of such places of business.

Moved by Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the City Attorney be instructed to prepare an ordinance regulating billiard and pool halls along the line requested by the committee of ladies.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

Whereas, the City is about to begin the improvement of the track known as Palmer Park and it will therefore become necessary to fence all that portion of said track lying

west of the track of the Denver & Rio Grande railroad, be it therefore.

Resolved, that the City Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to notify the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company to construct a fence on the west side of its right-of-way from a point near the crossing of the county road and feet south of mile post No. , and running feet along said right-of-way to a point near when the south boundary line of said Palmer Park track crosses the line of said railroad right-of-way.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmberg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

A communication from Henry Patterson, submitting a proposition for grading and cultivating that part of the Palmer Park track lying west of the track of the Denver & Rio Grande railroad, was read.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty be authorized to have an agreement drawn up between the City and Mr. Patterson covering the leveling and cultivation of the Palmer Park track.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the gas plant of the Grand Junction Electric, Gas & Mfg. Co. be furnished with water at the rate of 18 cents per thousand gallons.
