

Grand Junction, Colorado, April 9, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Rankin, Holmburg.

Acting City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 2d were read and approved.

The petition of W. H. Holman and other property owners on South Fifth street against permitting Armour & Co. to lay a railway track across Fifth street, was read.

A communication from Griffith & Watson, making inquiry why water had been turned off at the place of Nick Faciane, west of D. & R. G. railway tracks, was read. On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the communication was referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was referred to the Mayor.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the matter in reference to the granting of a permit to Armour & Co. to construct a railway track across South Fifth street, be deferred until next meeting of the Council. The motion carried, Mayor Todd voting in the negative.
