

Grand Junction, Colorado, April 18th, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 4 o'clock p. m., with Commissioner Vedder, Acting Mayor, in the chair.

Upon call of roll the following Commissioners responded as present: Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg. Absent: Mayer Todd.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 9th and adjourned session of April 12th were read and approved.

The quarterly report of the City Treasurer was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin the report was referred to the Auditor.

Representatives of Armour & Co. appeared before the Council and presented petition of John G. Broemser and others, withdrawing their objections to the construction of a railway track across South Fifth street.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Council reconsider the resolution in reference to granting Armour & Co. a permit to construct sidetrack across South Fifth street, rejected at the meeting of the Council held April 12th.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the following resolution be passed and adopted:

WHEREAS, Armour & Company, on March 25, 1912, made application in writing to the City of Grand Junction for permission to cross Fifth street south of the alley back of Blocks 161 and 162 with a side track; and

WHEREAS, they offer to construct said sidetrack as near the street grade as possible and to plank said track where it crosses Fifth Street on the outside and inside of the rail, and to maintain the same in a manner to insure a perfect crossing for vehicles of every description;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of said city does hereby grant a permit to said company to construct a track for the purposes herein specified across said Fifth street at the place heretofore mentioned, which permit shall be revocable as provided in section 127 of the Charter of Grand Junction, and also on condition that the said company shall maintain said track as specified, and also on condition that said sidetrack shall not be built wholly or in part on the alley south of Block 162. It is also understood and agreed that the said City shall at all times retain the right to regulate the said track and the use thereof, notwithstanding said permit.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution adopted.

Commissioner Rankin gave notice to the Clerk that Mayor Todd, absent from this meeting, had requested that he be recorded as favoring the resolution just passed.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commis-

sioner Holmburg, that Beck & Ely be granted a license to carry on the business of cement contractors.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the license granted.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the acting Mayor declared the motion carried, and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin that the Council adjourn.

The motion carried, and the Council then adjourned.
