

Grand Junction, Colo., April 30, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Rankin, Helmburg. Absent: Commissioner Vorbeck.

Acting City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 23d were read and approved.

The petition of Mrs. J. F. Cox and others in reference to the enforcement of certain sections of Ordinance No. 179 was read.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty.

The petition of the Woman's Club, asking the Council to construct a sidewalk and curb around the City's portion of Block 84, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Highways.

The petition of Ida M. Knowles and others, asking that a sidewalk be ordered constructed in front of lots 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30, in block 138, was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the petition be granted and the sidewalk ordered constructed as petitioned for.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yes; Vedder, yes; Rankin, yes; Helmburg, yes.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and the sidewalk as petitioned for ordered constructed.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty was submitted and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and it was so ordered.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

#### RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, evidence was secured against T. D. Reams in June and July, 1911, by detectives and others in the employ of the City of Grand Junction, the services of the said detectives costing the city about \$250.00, and

WHEREAS, informations were filed against the said T. D. Reams on or about July 5th, 1911, in the County Court of Mesa county on the charge of bootlegging and running a disorderly house, and



WHEREAS, the said T. D. Reams has not been brought to trial on either of the said charges; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that Deputy District Attorney McClintock be urged to bring the said T. D. Reams to trial on the said charges as speedily as possible.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the Council adjourned.
