

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 7th, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 30th were read and approved.

The petition of Mary E. Dewery and others, protesting against the granting by the Council of a permit to Horace T. DeLong to move a frame building to certain lots in Block 122, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the petition was referred to the Mayor.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was referred to the Mayor.

The quarterly report of the City Health Officer was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the report was referred to the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty.

On the petition of Mrs. J. F. Cox and others in reference to the enforcement of certain section of Ordinance No. 179 referred to The Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty, the Commissioner reported that every effort was being made to enforce the provisions of said ordinance. The report was accepted by the Council.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The proof of publication of an a proposed ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Amending Section 3 of Ordinance No. 145, entitled, 'An Ordinance Concerning Billiard and Pool Tables, " was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the proof of publication of said proposed ordinance was accepted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried, and the proposed ordinance was read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the ordinance as read and entitled "An Ordinance Amending Section 3 of Ordinance No. 145, entitled 'An Ordinance Concerning Billiard and Pool Tables,' " be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 198.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the matter of taking advertising space by the City in the Inter-Mountain Fruit Journal be referred to the Mayor and the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that a committee of five be appointed by the Mayor to take up the matter of the appointment of a director of publicity, vice Fred Shaffer, resigned, the committee to be composed of two members of the city council and three of the directors of the Chamber of Commerce, said committee to report at the next meeting of the council.

The motion carried, and the Mayor appointed as said committee: Commissioners Verbeck and Rankin of the city council, and Messrs. Price, Buthern and Ferd of the Chamber of Commerce.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the Council adjourned until Thursday, May 9th, at 4 o'clock p. m.
