

Grand Junction Colo. April 12, 1898.

The City Council met in regular session at 7:30 P. M. Mayor Cla presiding. and the following aldermen present: - Fallis, Hadcock, Starr, M. Kinney, Hadsforth, Helle, Meyer and Whorton.

The minutes of March 15, 19, 22 and 23, were read and approved.

A motion was made and seconded to consolidate the Street & Alley fund and Water and Light Fund. The roll was called on this motion resulting as follows: - Ald. voting: - Fallis, yea; Hadcock, yea; M. Kinney, yea; Starr, yea; Hadsforth, yea; Helle, yea; Meyer, yea; Whorton, yea. The Motion carried.

Ald. Whorton petitioned the council for permission to build a small room, on the East side of the Triangular Building, on 2nd Street.

On motion the petition was granted.

The monthly reports of the officers for the month of March were submitted and referred to the Finance Committee.

The Annual reports of the Treasurer and Clerk were submitted. The Clerk asked for further time to verify her report. The request was granted.

The Finance committee reported that the Officers report for the month of February were correct.

On motions the report of the Finance Com. was accepted. A proposition from C. M. White to attend to the running of the water in the ditches for the season, for \$150⁰⁰/₁₀₀ was read.

A motion was made to accept the proposition, the motion was amended that Mr. White be under the supervision of the Street Commissioner and all under supervision of the St. & Alley Com. The motion was laid & the roll was called as follows: Ald. voting: Fallis, yea; McKinney, yea; Hadcock, yea; Starr, yea; Madsworth, yea; Wells, yea; Meyer, yea; Whorton, yea.

A motion made & recorded that Mr. White be required to give a good and sufficient bond in the sum of \$500. Motion Carried.
