

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 21, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction Convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Commissioner Vedder, acting Mayor, in the chair.

Upon call of roll the following Commissioners responded as present: Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Todd.  
*City Attorney Buckley was present.*

The minutes of the regular meeting of May 14th were read and approved.

The quarterly report of the City Clerk was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was referred to the auditor.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the acting Mayor and City Clerk be instructed to notify Mr. J. W. Sawyer that the City will vacate the building now occupied by the City Engineer on June 1st next.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

A communication from S. R. Schaffer, in reference to the audit of the City's books and accounts, was read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the communication was laid on the table until next regular meeting.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried, and it was so ordered.

A proposed ordinance, entitled, "An Ordinance Repealing Ordinance No. 188, Passed and Adopted February 28, 1911," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the acting Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council then adjourned.
