All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried, and it was so ordered.

Meved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to order one carload of 6-inch Madison joint steel pipe, with fittings, for the Water department.

The metion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the metion was declared carried and it was so predered.

On metion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
