

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 11, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg.

City Attorney Buoklin was present.

The following bills having been approved by heads of departments and audited, were read by the Clerk:

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The proof of publication of an ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Repealing Ordinance No. 188, passed and adopted February 28, 1911," was presented and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the said proof of publication was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried, and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the proposed ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Repealing Ordinance No. 188, passed and adopted February 28,

Helmburg, that the proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Repealing Ordinance No. 188, passed and adopted February 28, 1911," be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeek, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 199.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance in Relation to Water Rents," was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Verbeek, that the proof of publication of the proposed ordinance as read be accepted and ordered placed on file.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeek, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried, and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance in Relation to Water Rents," be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 200.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

The following resolution, introduced by Commissioner Rankin, was read by the Clerk:

RESOLVED, that all contractors, owners or others constructing any cement sidewalk along any public thoroughfare in the city of Grand Junction shall be and hereby are required to stamp, on the surface thereof, at the time of construction, in a plain and legible manner, with letters about one inch in height, the name of the person, firm or corporation constructing said sidewalk and the month and year of such construction.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the Council then adjourned.
