WHEREAS, certain coal land near Grand Junction, Colorado, is still the property of the United States, which coal land is described as follows, to-wit: The NET NET Sec 15; and NENW and the NW NET Sec. 14; and the ET ET Sec. 10; and WE and WEET of Sec. 11, all in Township 1 North, Range 1 East, Ute Meridian, in Mesa County, Colorado;

and; WHEREAS, the City of Grand Junction is using large amounts of coal for municipal and other purposes, and as it is a growing city, its needs for coal will continue to increase in the future; and

WHEREAS, by the Constitution of the State of Colorado, and the Charter of the City of Grand Junction, said city is authorized to own and operate coal mines; and

WHEREAS, coal land in the vicinity of Grand Junction is rapidly becoming concentrated in the hands of a few owners who are constantly raising the price of coal to the consumers; and

WHEREAS, the ownership of said coal land by the city would conserve the interest of the whole people, and preserve for the public use said piece of coal land:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that an effort be made to secure from Congress and the United States Government title to said coal land; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor be authorized and How. Simon Guggenheim, M.S. Senato and instruted to send a copy of this resolution to Hon. Edw. T. Taylor, Congressman at Large from the State of Colorado, with a request that he make every effort to secure from Congress a grant to the city of said coal land, and that he endeavor to have the said coal land withdrawn from entry pending the securing of title of the said land from Congress.
