Moved by Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin that E. R. Romberg be elected City Engineer, to succeed Geo. L. Crawford, resigned.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that James Woods be appointed care taker at the intake of the Hannah Creek pipe line, and that he be allowed a salary of \$65⁰⁰ per month.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and James Woods duly appointed as care taker at Hannah Creek intake.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Kolmburg, that Tom Handel be appointed care-taker of the Pumping Plant; that he be allowed a salary of \$65⁰⁰ per month, and that his appointment date from July 1st, 1912.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and Tom Handel duly appointed as care-taker of the Pumping plant.
