

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 6, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Tedd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Tedd, Vedder, Verbeek, Rankin, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of July 30th were read and approved.

The petition of R. H. Bull, Chas. E. Cherrington, and others, asking the Council to rescind the resolution passed at its meeting of July 30th in reference to submitting the proposition of entering into negotiations for the purchase of the Grand Junction Electric Light plant, was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeek, that the petition be taken under advisement by the Council until Friday, August 9th.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Tedd, yea; Vedder, no; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The quarterly report of the City Health Officer was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty.
