The Celerade Pertland Cement Co., effering to furnish 23,000 sacks coment at the price of \$2.21 net per barrel, f. e. b. Grand Junetien, in carlead lets, the cement to be used during the present year of 1912.

The United States Pertland Cement Co., quoting a price of \$2.21 net per barrel, f. e. b. Grand Junction in earload lets, for approximately 23,000 barrels; no limit to time of delivery.

Meved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the bid of the United States Pertland Coment Co. be accepted, and that the City enter into a contract with said coment company for 23,000 barrels of Pertland coment at \$2.21 net per barrel, for Paving District No. 2; said contract to be subject to the results of the special election to be held August 27th, and also to the proposed amendment of the Charter in reference to contracts for paving work.

The metien being put, upon call of rell the Commissioners veted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbook, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayer declared the metion carried.

On metion of Commissioner Verbook, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
