

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 8, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in special called session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeek, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Rankin.

The special meeting having been called for the purpose of receiving and considering proposals for furnishing cement, the Council proceeded to open and consider bids.

Bids were received and opened from the following firms:

The Colorado Portland Cement Co., offering to furnish 23,000 sacks cement at the price of \$2.21 net per barrel, f. o. b. Grand Junction, in carload lots, the cement to be used during the present year of 1912.

The United States Portland Cement Co., quoting a price of \$2.21 net per barrel, f. o. b. Grand Junction in carload lots, for approximately 23,000 barrels; no limit to time of delivery.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the bid of the United States Portland Cement Co. be accepted, and that the City enter into a contract with said cement company for 23,000 barrels of Portland cement at \$2.21 net per barrel, for Paving District No. 2; said contract to be subject to the results of the special election to be held August 27th, and also to the proposed amendment of the Charter in reference to contracts for paving work.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Tedd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
