

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 9, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall with Mayer Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Rankin.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Council reconsider the resolution passed at the regular meeting held July 30, 1912, in reference to submitting to a vote of the people the question of entering into negotiations for the purchase of the Grand Junction electric light plant.

Commissioner Verbeck also seconded the motion to reconsider the resolution, and addressed the Council and others present, stating his position and views upon the question involved in the resolution.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The resolution was then taken up for reconsideration, and it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the resolution in reference to submitting to a vote of the people at the next special election the question of entering into negotiations for the purchase of the Grand Junction electric light plant, be laid on the table.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution tabled.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council then adjourned.
