

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 13, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Rankin.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of August 6th, the special meeting of August 8th, and adjourned session of August 9th, were read and approved.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the same was referred to the Mayor.

The labor account of the Department of Highways of the total amount of \$319.80, for work done in Paving District No. 4, having been approved by the head of the department and audited, was read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the labor account as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the account allowed.

The depository bond of the Union Trust & Banking Co. having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, accepted and ordered placed on file.

Welch & Teupain having made application for a license to carry on the business of cement sidewalk contractors, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the license be granted when satisfactory bond is filed with the City Clerk.

The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the Council adjourned.
