I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. Those present were Hearing Officer Mike Grattan, City Attorney John Shaver, and Deputy City Clerk Juanita Peterson.

II. APPLICATIONS TO RENEW LIQUOR AND BEER LICENSES

1. TJ's Billiards, LLC dba TJ's Billiards, 509 28 ½ Road, Grand Junction, CO 81501, Tavern

Alan Allen, owner, was present.

The application for renewal for TJ's Billiards, LLC dba TJ's Billiards was found to be in order and approved.

2. Rosco's Inc. dba Kannah Creek Brewing Company, 1960 N. 12th Street, Grand Junction, CO 81501, Brew Pub

Jim Jeffryes, owner, was present.

The application for renewal for Rosco's Inc. dba Kannah Creek Brewing Company was found to be in order and approved.

3. Dillon Companies, Inc. dba City Market #1, 2770 Hwy. 50 South, Grand Junction, CO 81501, 3.2% Beer Retail (Off-Premises)

No one was present representing the applicant.

The application for renewal for Dillon Companies Inc. dba City Market #1 was found to be in order and approved.

4. Dillon Companies, Inc. dba City Market #32, 200 Rood Avenue, Grand Junction, CO 81501, 3.2% Beer Retail (Off-Premises)

No one was present representing the applicant.

The application for renewal for Dillon Companies Inc. dba City Market #32 was found to be in order and approved.

5. CST Metro LLC dba Corner Store #1720, 2520 Broadway, Grand Junction, CO 81507, 3.2% Beer Retail (Off-Premises)

No one was present representing the applicant.

The application for renewal for CST Metro LLC dba Corner Store #1720 was found to be in order and approved.

III. APPLICATION TO RENEW LIQUOR AND BEER LICENSES WITH TASTING PERMIT

1. Fisher's Liquor Barn, Inc. dba Fisher's Liquor Barn, 2438 F Road, Grand Junction, CO 81505, Retail Liquor Store with Tasting Permit

Brandi Pollack, owner, was present.

The application for renewal and tasting permit for Fisher's Liquor Barn, Inc. dba Fisher's Liquor Barn was found to be in order and approved.

2. Junction Liquors LLC dba Fun Junction Liquors, 510 28 ³/₄ Road, Unit 202, Grand Junction, CO 81501, Retail Liquor Store with Tasting Permit

No one was present representing the applicant.

The application for renewal and the tasting permit for Junction Liquors LLC dba Fun Junction Liquors was found to be in order and approved.

IV. APPLICATION FOR MODIFICATION OF PREMISES

1. Sodexo, America, LLC dba Sodexo, University Center, 1455 North 12th Street, Grand Junction, CO 81501, Hotel and Restaurant with Optional Premises

Modify the existing premises to remodel the activity lounge at the far southwestern corner of the first floor of the University Center, addition of a small outdoor patio, and the additional area to the south end of the premise has been enclosed as part of the building.

Mr. Joe Winegardner, general manager for Sodexo and John Williams, attorney representing CMU, were present.

Hearing Officer Grattan requested clarification on this modification request. Ms. Peterson reported that the paperwork is in order and all reports are in compliance. The modification was posted immediately outside the patio area as requested by Hearing Officer Grattan after the August 8th meeting giving notice to anyone who would wish to attend the hearing, noting this would be accepted for satisfying the needs and desires of the neighborhood.

Hearing Officer marked the attachment to DR-8442 submitted by Sodexo (Exhibit A) outlining the complete modification of premises to the University Center Building, the diagram of the premises as of 2012 (Exhibit 2), diagram of the modification (Exhibit 3), enlarged diagrams of the fireside lounge and The Point Pub (Exhibits 4, 5, and 6) (all exhibits attached) and entered them into the record.

City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Winegardner to identify the blue area on the diagram. Mr. Winegardner said on Exhibit 3, the blue shaded area is about 1,044 square feet, which is about 1.5% of the building. This is the only additional area added. The green area will be converted to The Point Pub which is shown in detail on the other Exhibits 4, 5, and 6.

Ms. Meghan Woodland, GJPD, had questions of the applicant from not only her but from the CMU police officers on how this would be run within the college building, what type of security, how they will address underage issues, and if this is open to the public. City Attorney Shaver said that they could have Mr. Winegardner generally address what will be done to address the concerns Ms. Woodland brought up, and then Ms. Woodland can address the other issues at a later date with Mr. Winegardner.

Mr. Winegardner described that the green area on the diagram comes into a games room area, they will check ID's and then wristband at the area at time of order, where the drinks are served, they will not be allowed to leave the area. City Attorney Shaver asked about the dashed red line of the boundary area. Mr. Winegardner said there are glassed walls that establish the area looking out into the hallway. He said the students have been trained by the City in the alcohol server training and this will be a continuing project with Sodexo and CMU.

Attorney Williams said the license for The Point on 12th Street has been surrendered just recently.

Hearing Officer Grattan asked if there was anyone in attendance in opposition of this modification. Seeing none, he asked City Attorney Shaver his thoughts. City Attorney Shaver said he would like to enter the Exhibit A with multiple pages into the record, it appears from the meeting two weeks ago and today, the needs and desires have been met, and the premise was posted as required, so he has no objections to the request, and recommends approval.

Hearing Officer Grattan said the posting was made as required; there is no one in opposition of the request, the license is in effect and this is just a relatively small area modified. The modification for Sodexo America, LLC, the College Center, has been approved as submitted with the modification as shown on the Exhibits submitted.

V. APPLICATION FOR A SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT

1. Hilltop Health Services Corporation, 1331 Hermosa Drive, Grand Junction, CO 81506 for Western Colorado Classic Auto Event, on August 30, 2014 from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and August 31, 2014 from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. located at Canyon View Park, 730 24 Road, Grand Junction, CO, Malt, Vinous, and Spirituous

President: Michael Stahl, 2599 Kayden Court, Grand Junction CO 81505
Event Manager: Sarah Catlin, 772 Castle Drive, Palisade, CO 81526

Ms. Sarah Catlin, event manger and employee of Hilltop, was present.

Ms. Peterson reported the paperwork was turned in a timely manner, all the reports are in compliance, there were no issues from last year's event, and the premise was posted.

City Attorney Shaver provided Ms. Catlin with two documents marked with A and B and asked Ms. Catlin what the documents are, and if she has personal knowledge of the documents. Ms. Catlin said it is the questionnaire and affidavit that she completed but it is signed by Mr. Stahl, the CEO, and document B, the map of the event. City Attorney asked Ms. Catlin to explain the event. Ms. Catlin said this is a major fundraiser for Hilltop; it is a car show. There is expected to be close to 400 cars, they had 275 last year. FCI has provided fencing for the event which will tie into the existing fencing. City Attorney Shaver said to look at Exhibit B. Ms. Catlin said they would be moving the boundary slightly north. Ms. Catlin amended the diagram submitted to also include two entrances. The entire exhibit is fenced, one must pay to enter the secured area; the fence will keep the alcohol contained and keep the vendors and the vehicles protected for the entire event.

City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Catlin her relationship to the event. Ms. Catlin said that she was hired specifically by Hilltop to run this event. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Catlin if there were any issues last year. She responded no. She is estimating about 6,000 people in attendance this year. They have 12 security personnel and volunteers manning the event. Friday and Saturday night security will be from Grand Valley Security.

There was no one present in opposition of the application.

Hearing Officer Grattan admitted Exhibits A and B into the record (attached) and found that pursuant to Colorado State Statutes 12-48-106, there are no grounds to deny the special events permit, it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event (it is a car show held in the past with no problems), its location within the community, or the failure of the applicant in a past special event to conduct the event in compliance with applicable law. He found that the application for a special events permit submitted by Hilltop Health Services Corporation was in order and approved it.

2. Grand Junction Elks Home Association, 249 S. 4th Street, Grand Junction, CO 81501 for a Beer Garden at Farmer's Market, on August 21, 28, September 4, 11, 18, and 28, 2014 from 4:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. located at 5th Street, ½ block south of Main Street, Grand Junction, CO, Malt and Vinous

Mr. Ed Crilly, secretary of the Elks, was present.

The paperwork was turned in a timely manner, the reports are in compliance, and the premise was noticed. This special event permit will be in conjunction with the remaining Farmer's Markets on Thursday evenings.

City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Crilly to look at the documents presented to him marked A and B. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Crilly if the information contain in the document marked with an A is true and accurate. Mr. Crilly replied affirmatively. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Crilly whose signature was located on the second page of the questionnaire. Mr. Crilly said one was his and one was the notary from the bank. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Crilly to tell the Authority about the proposed event. Mr. Crilly said they were contacted by the Downtown Development Authority (DDA) to host a beer garden. The Elks will run this the same way as they run the Oktoberfest beer garden. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Crilly to describe how they are going to ensure everyone is 21 years of age. Mr. Crilly responded they would be conducting this just like they do with all of their events which is ID's checked and wristbands provided at the door, and they only have the one entrance and exit.

City Attorney Shaver had Mr. Crilly look at Exhibit B and asked him to describe the area. In terms of security, they will have a 4' high fence around the area, and they will have only one entrance. This area is closed and included in Farmer's Market, but the first for the beer garden area. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Crilly to describe how the Lodge will provide trained employees. Mr. Crilly said he has been involved for over 36 years as part of the Elk's Lodge events, all are trained with the City's alcohol server seller training, and there have never been any issues. Mr. Crilly stated due to the numerous special events the Elks have been involved with like Oktoberfest, Poker Rally, and other events requiring a special event permit at the Lodge, they are experienced in these types of events.

Hearing Officer Grattan asked Mr. Crilly to look at question 6 on the questionnaire where it says the DDA will have 2 roving security officers and one at the beer garden. Mr. Crilly just said they would be Lodge volunteers. Mr. Crilly explained that DDA will provide two roving security officers from Lone Star Security for the Farmer's Market, and the Elks will have one security from Lone Star Security at the beer garden. Hearing Officer Grattan asked Mr. Crilly if one purchases a beer in the garden could they walk the rest of the Farmer's Market? Mr. Crilly said no, one must stay in the beer garden area.

Hearing Officer asked if there was anyone in opposition of this event. There was none.

Hearing Officer Grattan admitted Exhibits A and B into the record (attached) and found that pursuant to Colorado State Statutes 12-48-106, there are no grounds to deny the special events permit, it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event (it is a beer garden within Farmer's Market), its location within the community, or the failure of the applicant in a past special event to conduct the event in compliance with applicable law. He found that the application for a special events permit submitted by Grand Junction Elks Home Association was in order and approved it.

Hearing Officer Grattan moved to change up the agenda by moving the The Avalon Theatre Foundation to after MZ Entertainment, LLC to give Ms. Brown a chance to read the Special Event check report from the event last year as there were some compelling allegations.

VI. OTHER BUSINESS

1. MZ Entertainment, LLC dba Thunderstruck Valley, 436 Main Street, Grand Junction, CO 81501, Tavern with Outdoor Dining Lease – Review of a temporary certificate of occupancy (CO) for the establishment as the existing hood assembly needs to bring in tempered air to make it work. The new assembly has been ordered.

Mr. Mark Towner, owner, was present along with Mr. John Pfeifer, counsel for MZ Entertainment.

Hearing Officer Grattan said Ms. Peterson provided him with a copy of a request from the contractor for the hood unit asking for a short extension, and City Attorney Shaver provided Hearing Officer Grattan a matrix that he has not looked at it.

Hearing Officer Grattan asked if there was anyone present who is opposed to the extension being requested on the hood unit. There wasn't anyone who spoke up so Hearing Officer Grattan asked if the City had any objection to the extension. City Attorney Shaver said no that he did not, so this will be moved to the September 3, 2014 Liquor and Beer meeting. Hearing Officer Grattan said a Final Certificate of Occupancy will resolve the hood issue as long as that is presented to Ms. Peterson on or before September 3rd at 2:00 p.m.

City Attorney Shaver said that Ms. Woodland is the author of the matrix document, but what City Attorney Shaver knows is that this document lists a number of issues since the opening in May which may demonstrate improper behavior of the licensee. City Attorney Shaver explained that since the applicant has a temporary license there are a few things that can be done regarding this application and he recommending having Ms. Woodland address the report.

Meghan Woodland, GJPD, said she was instructed by the Police Chief and her supervisor to compile this information listing the calls for service. The applicant has received a copy of this, just in a different format. She has met with Cameron Collard of Thunderstruck Valley regarding these issues.

City Attorney Shaver said what he would request is that this issue also be continued to the September 3rd Liquor and Beer meeting as this was provided for information only and everyone would then have a chance to review it.

Hearing Officer Grattan said that Mr. Starritt will be presiding over the September 3rd meeting. City Attorney Shaver said that he would agree to wait until Hearing Officer Grattan would be back as the Hearing Officer.

John Pfeifer representative of MZ Entertainment was present and said he would not be available on September 3rd.

Hearing Officer Grattan said an extension will be given on their temporary permit, and asked that this matrix document be provided to Mr. Pfeifer. He advised that whatever the City is going to file on MZ Entertainment, if anything, will then be heard on October 1st. The temporary permit will be extended for an additional 60 days as allowed by 12-47-303 (4). All present were in agreement.

2. The Avalon Theatre Foundation, Inc. PO Box 2243, Grand Junction, CO 81502 for the Grand Junction Off Road Beer Garden, on August 29, 2014 from 4:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. and August 30, 2014 from Noon to 10:00 p.m. located at 4th Street from Main Street to the alley, Grand Junction, CO, Malt and Vinous

Event Manager: Robin Brown, 521 Rood Avenue, Grand Junction, CO 81501

Ms. Robin Brown, event manager, was present.

Ms. Peterson reported the paperwork is in order and submitted in a timely manner, the premise was noticed, and Ms. Peterson provided Ms. Brown the report submitted last year by Officer Keech regarding the special event checks. There were several items not being done in compliance with the questionnaire submitted last year such as not as much security as indicated, ID's checks were not being done as stated, numerous patrons without wristbands as required were consuming alcohol, and then a misunderstanding regarding the time to shut down and discontinue alcohol services was noted.

City Attorney Shaver handed Ms. Brown several documents marked A and B and asked her what these documents are. Ms. Brown responded they are the questionnaire and map submitted. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Brown whose signature is on page 2 of the questionnaire, and she responded hers. City Attorney Shaver asked with this signature is Ms. Brown representing the items in the questionnaire to be true and accurate. She responded affirmatively. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Brown specifically about question 4. which asked about any violations or citations issued during the event in the past. Ms. Brown said none was issued, but given the report that was filed that she just read, there were issues. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Brown to

respond to the issues in the report regarding the service after hours, multiple drinks given to one person, several without wristbands, and the number of security on site. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Brown if she was unaware of these issues prior to reading this report. Ms. Brown said that she and Officer Keech had a conversation regarding some of these, but no citations were issued. City Attorney Shaver asked now that Ms. Brown has been made aware of this report, is there any way she will change the operation this year to ensure the service is conducted lawfully? Ms. Brown said based on this report, they checked ID's next to the bar last year, but she now she would check ID's as they came into the event. She said the issue with people drinking alcohol without a wristband, was due to others buying people drinks. On Saturday afternoon, they changed the way they were doing business, as patrons could only buy one drink and must have a wristband on. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Brown about the different number of security that she indicated would be there. Ms. Brown said that to cut costs, they had TIPS trained staff checking ID's and didn't believe she needed a paid security person doing that. She did not realize this was an issue. She said that what she has indicated on the questionnaire this year for security is what they will stay with.

City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Brown about the location on Exhibit B. Ms. Brown described the area; Ms. Brown said they have 3 entrances and exits, and that this is the same location as last year. City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Brown who will be at each entrance/exit. Ms. Brown said this will be volunteer security. City Attorney Shaver asked who these volunteers are. Ms. Brown said the Avalon Theatre Foundation Board members and volunteers for the Foundation.

Hearing Officer Grattan said there were other items in Officers Keech's report that indicated to him a lack of complying with the requirements set forth in the statutes and the regulations.

City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Brown to react to the report. Ms. Brown said that she took it very seriously and believed she had complied with everything she had spoken to Officer Keech about at the event. The serving after hours, Ms. Brown stated she understood that they could not sell after that time, but did not realize they could not have any alcohol on site at that ending time until Officer Keech explained that to her. She said that will not be a problem this year, and admitted she did not have any experience in holding these events prior to last year.

Mr. Crilly from the Elks Lodge interjected that having fewer entrances and exits have helped the Elks Lodge over the years with several of the issues that have been brought up today. Ms. Brown said it is a valid issue.

Ms. Brown said she would be willing to change the diagram to have only one entrance/exit.

Hearing Officer Grattan said the overall point from the memorandum from Officer Keech said that he believed that the event was not complying with the liquor laws. Anything that facilitates this is good by Hearing Officer Grattan.

Ms. Brown requested to modify the diagram to only have one entrance.

Hearing Officer Grattan admitted Exhibits A and B as amended into the record (attached) and found that pursuant to Colorado State Statutes 12-48-106, there are three criteria to deny the special events permit. One, it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event (it is a beer garden), secondly, its location within the community, but thirdly the failure of the applicant in a past special event to conduct the event in compliance with applicable law. It is in his discretion to either approve this or not. After the testimony today, he believes Ms. Brown will follow the recommendations given by Officer Keech last year, and understanding and complying with the liquor laws, he will approve the application for a special events permit submitted by The Avalon Theatre Foundation Inc.

Modification of Premises - University Center Building

Sodexo America, LCC holds an H&R License covering the entire University Center building on the Colorado Mesa University campus. Sodexo America, LLC is the food and beverage service provider for Colorado Mesa University. While this H&R License has several optional premises licenses attached to it, this request involves only the University Center building. The University Center building contains a total of 101,500 square feet.

Colorado Mesa University is remodeling the activity lounge on the far southwestern corner of the first floor of the University Center. This existing space within the licensed premises is being remodeled to create a pub-like food and beverage and recreational activity venue. This room contains approximately 5,400 square feet or approximately 5% of the total square footage of the premises. This new venue will be called "The Point."

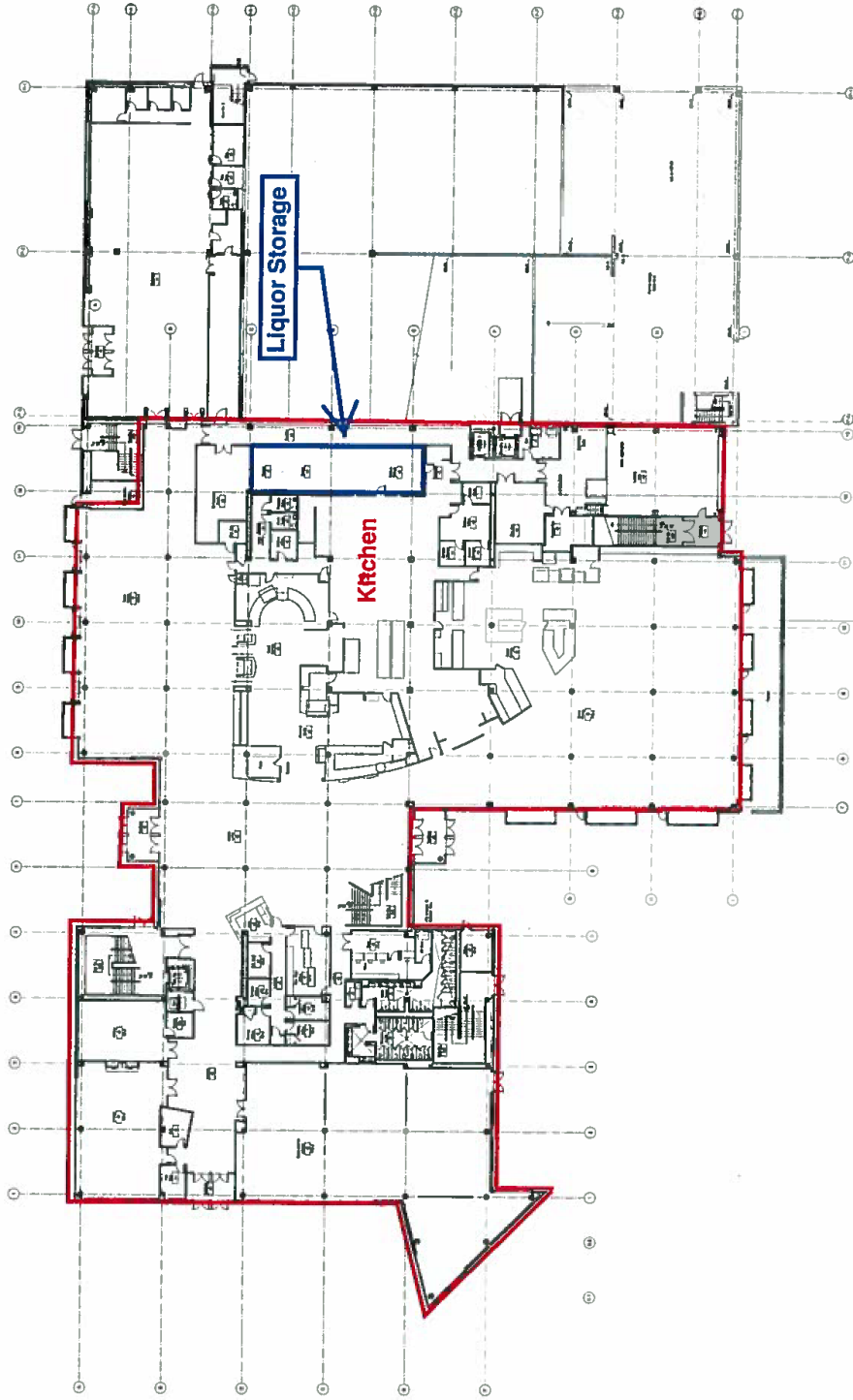
Food, non-alcoholic and alcoholic beverages will be served from a small bar or counter at the south end of the room and tables and booths will be added in the triangular space known as the "Prow." There will be seating for approximately 40 at tables.

In addition a small outdoor patio (21 feet by 61 feet) will be added and contain approximately 8 tables. This patio will be surrounded by a 42 inch high barrier system and will only be accessible from the licensed premises. The patio will add only 1,300 square feet to the licensed premises. This represents less than 1.5% of the licensed premises.

Attached are "before" and "after" diagrams, illustrations of the proposed changes to the premises, and photos of the patio barrier system. The additional area to the south end of the premise has been enclosed as part of the building and is now considered to be part of the licensed premise. This area contains approximately 1,265 square feet or approximately 1.25% of the total square footage of the premises.

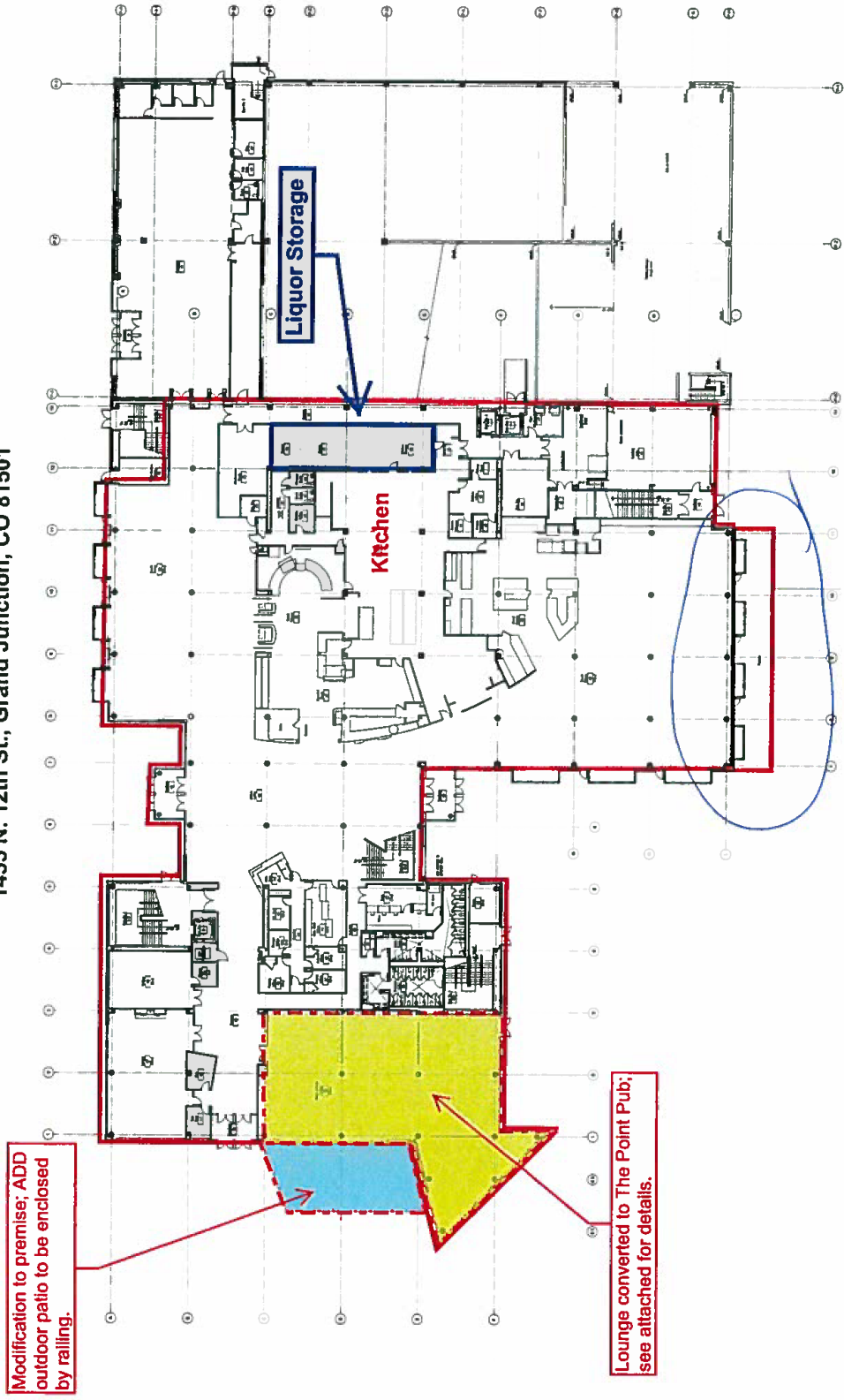
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BEFORE (2012)

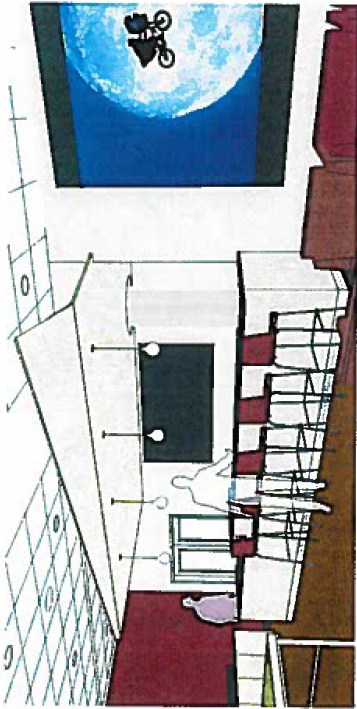
AFTER - August 2014

1455 N. 12th St., Grand Junction, CO 81501



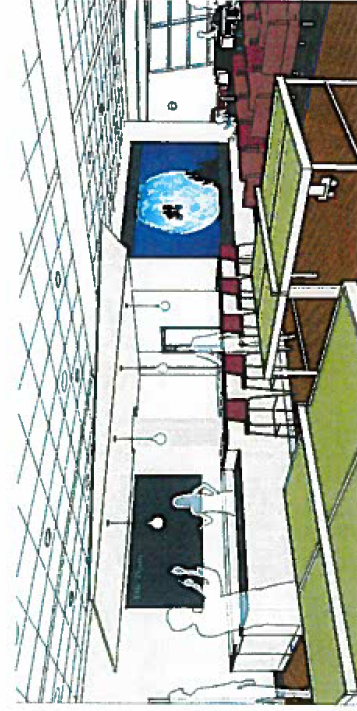
Modification to premise; ADD outdoor patio to be enclosed by railing.

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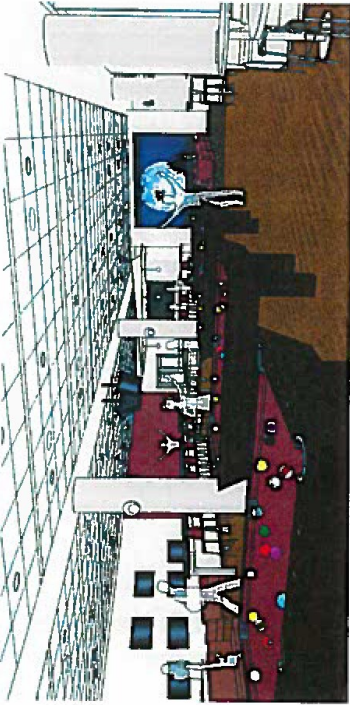

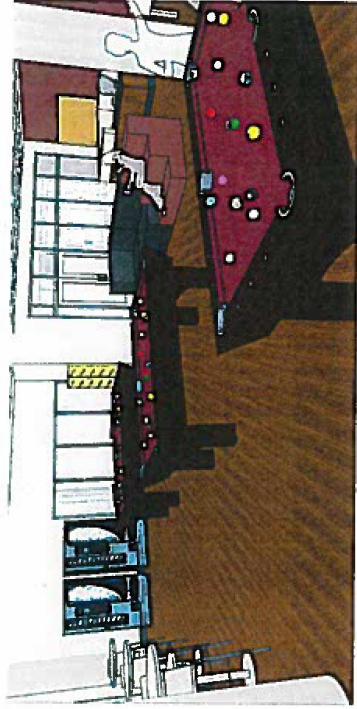

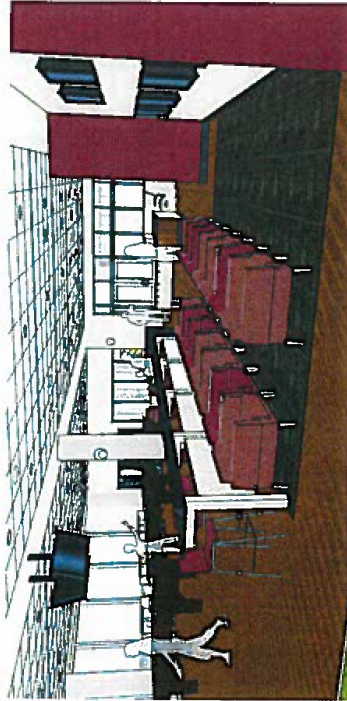
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LOUNGE AREA - FROM NORTHWEST

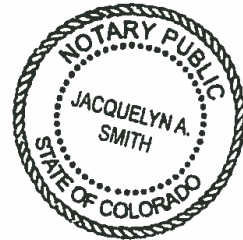

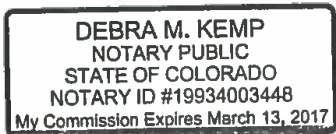

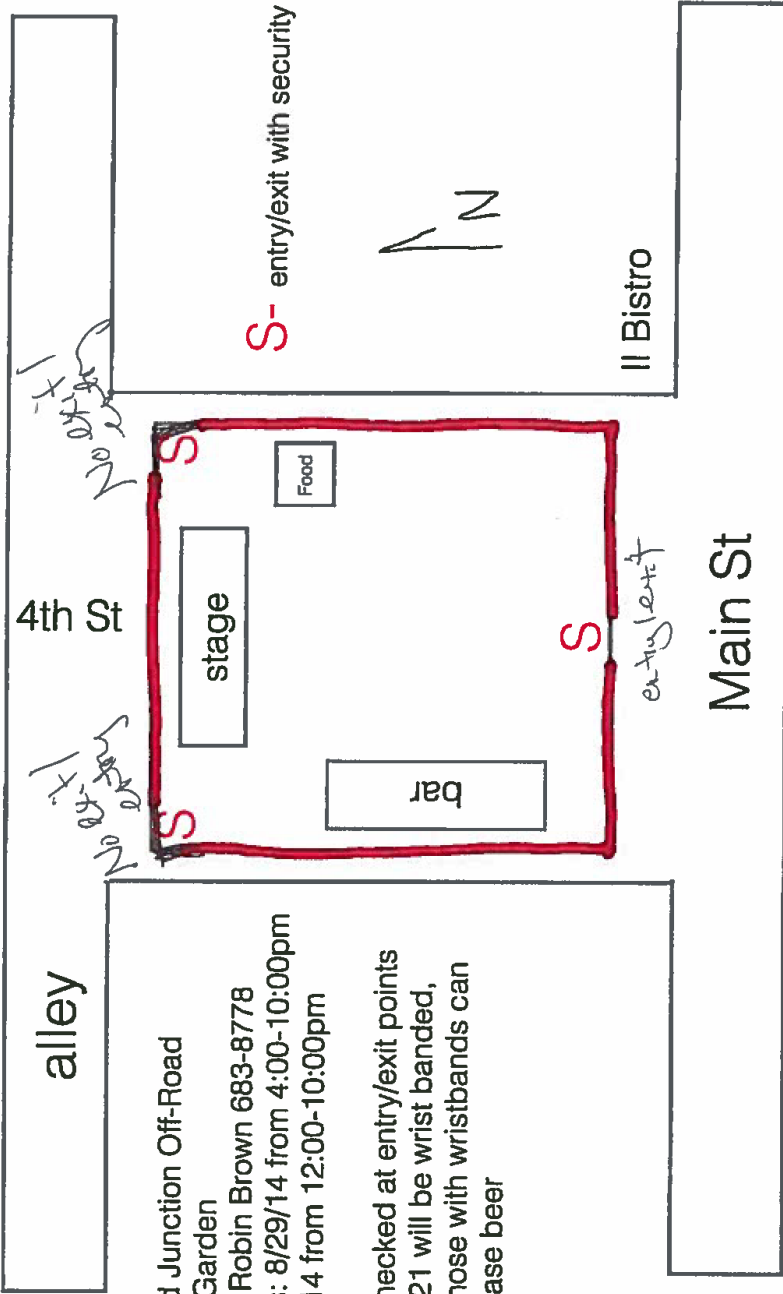
