

Grand Junction, Colorado, December 31st, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance in Relation to Municipal Civil Service," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

Abe Goodman having made application for renewal of license to carry on the business of plumbing and his bond as such having been approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the said Goodman be granted a plumbers' license for the fiscal year 1913.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the license granted.

The appointment of a Civil Service Commission, under the provisions of the Charter, *being taken up,* nominations for members of the Commission were declared to be in order.

Nominations were then made as follows:

For the term of two years, O. D. Williams was placed in nomination.

A ballot was taken, resulting in the unanimous election of O. D. Williams as a member of the Civil Service Commission for the term of two years.

For the term of four years, Geo. F. Parker and J. E. Moorhead were placed in nomination.

A ballot was taken, resulting in the election of J. E. Moorhead for the term of four years.

For the term of six years, J. Monroe Stewart was nominated and unanimously elected as a member of the Civil Service Commission.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Commissioner of Highways be authorized and instructed to draw up an agreement with the Grand Valley Canal Company for the construction of a reinforced concrete bridge at the intersection of Eighth street and North Avenue, and to procure bids for its construction.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
