## Grand Junction, Colorado, August 20, 1912.

On metion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Highways with power to act.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayer, the same was on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, accepted and ordered placed on file.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the issue of \$450,000 bends authorized at a special election held the 29th day of April , 1911, authorized the expenditure of a part of that money for the "Improvement and repairing , enlargement and extension" of the present water system; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Water and Sewers has already made arrangements for the early extension of the street mains of the city , and the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies has already purchased pipe and supplies for such extensions; and

WHEREAS, the construction of the Kannah Creek mountain water system is completed, excepting a very little miner finishing work; and

WHEREAS, it appears that there will be more than \$10,000 surplus in the Kannah Creek Fund after the completion of all the work; be it, therefore

RESOLVED, that the City Clerk be, and he is hereby instructed to draw a warrant for the sum of \$10,000 on the Kannah Creek Fund, and the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies is hereby instructed to credit said amount of \$10,000 to a Special Water Fund, so that funds will be available to cover the cost of such extensions and repairs.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayer declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

## RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, it appears from the report of Dec. 5th, 1911, made to the Council by Auditor John H. Baker of his audit to the period closing with October 31st, 1911, that said Auditor Baker in his report transferred the amount of \$11,513.09 to the Water Fund which the City Council had by a resolution, passed August 1th, 1911, transferred to the General Fund, thereby showing a disagreement between the report of said Auditor Baker and the heads of the city in these funds to that around a said auditor Baker and the beeks of the city in these funds to that amount; and

WHEREAS, it appears that it was necessary for this transfer to be made to the General Fund in order that outstanding warrants for said amount could be called in and paid; and

WHEREAS, it is the sense of this Council that in the report of the present auditor, Mr. S. R. Schaeffer, should have his report agree with the transfer as it has been made on the records of the preceedings of the Council as shown in the resolution of August 15th, 1911; be it, therefore,

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that Auditor S. R. Schaeffer be, and he is hereby directed to show this transfer of said \$11,813.09 in accordance with the said resolution, by showing said amount as credited to the General Fund.

Meyed by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The metion being put, upon call of rell the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd,

yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and

the resolution passed and adopted.

Commissioner Vedder, to whom had been referred the matter of the water rental of the Grand Junction Electric, Gas & Manufacturing Co., reported to the Council that on meters he had found that for a period of 60 days, from June 21 to reading of the August 20, the said Grand Junction Electric , Gas & Manufacturing Company had consumed

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1,446,300 gallens of water.

The report of Commissioner Vedder was accepted by the Council, but no action was taken in the matter of changing the water rental of said company.

Meved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the Council adjourn.

The motion carried and the Council then adjourned.
