The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the acting Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

Warrant No. 13,112 payable to James Woods for salary for October, for \$65.00, being reported by Commissioner Vedder to have been accidentally destroyed by fire, it was moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the City Clerk be authorized and instructed to issue another warrant in lieu thereof for \$65.00, payable to Mr. Woods.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows:

Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried, and it was so ordered.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned.
