The petition of H. B. Eldridge and others, asking the Council to order a cement sidewalk constructed on Rood avenue, commencing at the corner of First and Rood and extending the length of the property of Mrs. Stoddard, was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the petition be granted, and that the sidewalk petitioned for be ordered constructed.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The metion being put, upon call of rell, the Commissioners voted as fellows: Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Acting Mayor declared the metion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.
