

Grand Junction, Colorado, October 15, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeek, Rankin, Holmburg.

The minutes of the regular meeting of October 8th were read and approved.

The petition of F. E. Welch and others, asking the Council to order a cement sidewalk constructed on both sides of Fourth street from Hill avenue to Reed avenue, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Highways.

A communication from A. C. Schwenker in reference to garbage collection was presented and read.

The quarterly report of the City Treasurer was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was referred to the auditor.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the bids be laid on the table until next regular meeting.

The motion was lost.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that when the Council adjourns it adjourn until Friday, October 18th, and that the bids for garbage collection be then taken up for consideration.

The motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the City Attorney be instructed to take up the matter of a deed to the land on which Artesian Well No. 2 is located and take proper steps to obtain same at once.

The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the Council then adjourned until Friday, October 18th, at 4 o'clock p. m.
