

Grand Junction, Colorado, October 22, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the adjourned session of October 11th, and regular meeting of October 15th and adjourned session of October 18th, were read and approved.

Messrs. Ela, Lane and Phillips, of the Library Board, appeared before the Council in reference to the appropriation for the Public Library for the next fiscal year, presenting an estimate by the Librarian of amount needed to properly conduct the Library next year, and asking the Council to make an appropriation of \$2,000 for the Library for next fiscal year.

Communications were received and read from Wm. A. Lynch, A. C. Schwenker and A. O. Shaff, making application for the position of garbage collector.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the applications for garbage collector were ordered placed on file.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Highways was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the report was referred to the auditor.

The report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers for the third quarter of the current year was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was referred to the auditor.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the matter in reference to the title of a certain lot in Block 3 of Mobley's Subdivision be referred to the Commissioner of Highways, the City Attorney and the City Engineer. The motion carried.

The Commissioner of Finance and Supplies submitted to the Council the Annual City Estimate for the Fiscal year 1913, showing an estimate of the receipts and disbursements for said fiscal year; also amount of uncalled outstanding warrants at this date.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the annual estimate of the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, as submitted and read, be accepted and ordered placed on file.

The motion carried.

The bill of C. P. McCary for one 5-ton Iroquois steam roller for \$1,920.40, including freight on same, having been approved by the Commissioner of Highways, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the same be allowed and warrant ordered drawn for the amount.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows:

Tedd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayer declared the motion carried and the bill allowed.

An agreement between the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company and the City of Grand Junction, covering the use of a right-of-way for the construction of a sewer pipe line for Sewer District No. 4 across said railroad company's right-of-way on Main street, was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the following resolution be passed and adopted:

RESOLUTION.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the contract covering use of right-of-way for pipe line crossing under the tracks and road bed of the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company, in form as just read and attached thereto be entered into by the City of Grand Junction, and the Mayer is hereby authorized to execute said agreement on behalf of the City, and the Clerk is hereby authorized to attest the same and affix the seal of the City thereto.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Tedd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayer declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Council adjourn.

The motion carried, and the Council then adjourned.
