

Grand Junction, Colorado, October 29, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeek, Rankin, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of October 22d and special meeting of October 25th were read and approved.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

A proposed Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance to Amend Section 1 of Article VI of Ordinance 92, entitled An Ordinance Concerning Water Works, and to Repeal Certain Other Ordinances Passed and Adopted February 19, 1900," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

The quarterly reports of the City Clerk and the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty having been examined and approved by the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, it was moved by Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the reports be accepted and placed on file. The motion carried and it was so ordered.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that A. C. Schwenker be appointed <sup>City</sup> Garbage Collector at a salary of \$100. per month for himself and team, his appointment to date from December 1st, 1912, and that he be required to give a bond in the amount of \$500.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and A. C. Schwenker duly appointed city garbage collector.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned.
