

Grand Junction, Colorado, September 5, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeek, Rankin, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of August 27th and adjourned sessions of August 28th and 29th were read and approved.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the same was referred to the Mayor.

Messrs. Watson and Stone and Mrs. O'Boyle appeared before the Council in reference to the title of a certain strip of land on the west side of South 7th Street, south of the right of way of the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad, which strip of land has been in the possession and use of the Mesa Flour Mill Company since the year 1887, and asked that the Council take such action as may be necessary to relinquish the City's claim to said strip of land.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the matter was referred to the Mayor and the Commissioner of Highways.
