

Grand Junction, Colorado, September 11th, 1912.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of September 3d and adjourned sessions of September 5th and 6th were read and approved.

The bill of Harry Sadderis for \$12.70, for alfalfa hay, having been approved by the Commissioner of Highways, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the bill be allowed and warrant ordered drawn for the amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yes; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bill allowed.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that J. S. Hynes, Chief of the Fire Department, be allowed \$25.00 for expenses to attend the National Convention of Firemen at Denver.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and it was so ordered.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the Council adjourned.
