

Grand Junction, Colorado, September 24, 1912.

All the Commissioners having been duly notified, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in special session at 10 o'clock a. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg.

Bids for the furnishing of asphalt to the City, submitted by two concerns to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, being under consideration, it was moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to order 60,000 gallons, more or less, of the Bermuda Road Asphalt for Paving District No. 2, at 18.4 cents (eighteen and 4-10) per gallon, f. o. b. Grand Junction.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and it was so ordered.
