

Grand Junction, Colorado, April 5, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

A communication from S. R. Schaeffer, submitting a proposal to audit the city books and accounts for the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1913, for the sum of \$375.00, was read.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proposal of Mr. Schaeffer be accepted, and that he be employed to audit the city books for the current fiscal year.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

A communication from Milne & Blakeslee in reference to bill of \$165.90 for use of the city trenching machine, and asking a reduction in said bill, was read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that no reduction be made in the bill rendered Milne & Blakeslee for use of trenching machine.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The quarterly report of the Public Librarian was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The quarterly report of the Chief of the Fire Department was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the same was referred to the Mayor.

The report of the City Treasurer for the first quarter of the year 1913 was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the same was referred to the auditor.

The bond of P. C. Lowe as master plumber having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the bond be accepted and filed, and that Mr. Lowe be granted a license to carry on the business of plumbing.

The motion carried.

A member of the organization known as the I. W. W. appeared before the Council and stated that about 200 members of the organization would pass through the city within a few days, and asked that the Council provide feed for the men.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Mayor be instructed by the Council to purchase enough feed for the 200 members of the I. W. W. to provide two meals for them, the amount to be expended for same not to exceed \$25.00.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows:
Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, no; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, no.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned.
