

Grand Junction, Colorado, April 15, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 1st, adjourned session of April 2d, regular meeting of April 5th, and special meetings of April 11th and 12th, were read and approved.

The petition of W. R. Vinton and others, asking Council to take such action as may seem proper in order that the Haggerty irrigation ditch, running along Third avenue in Milldale subdivision, may be closed, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Highways.

The petition of W. H. Hammentree and others, asking the creation of a sidewalk district in Crawford's Addition, was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the petition be received and filed, and that the City Attorney and Clerk be instructed to examine the same to see if the signers thereof represent the 33 1-3 per cent. or more of the frontage of the real estate to be improved.

The motion carried.

The bond of Edward Johnson, cement contractor, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the same be accepted and filed.

The motion carried.
