

Grand Junction, Colorado, April 29, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 22d were read and approved.

F. E. Welch having made application for renewal of license as cement contractor, and having filed his bond as such, it was moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the bond be accepted and filed, and the license granted.

The motion carried.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Highways was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the same was referred to the auditor.

The quarterly report of the City Health Officer was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The following bills having been approved by heads of departments and audited, were read by the Clerk:

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the bills as read be allowed, and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 206, passed and adopted the 3d day of December, 1912, entitled 'An Ordinance in Relation to Water Rents,' " was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Mayor be authorized to employ Wm. A. Knoche as a special night policeman for the residence district, pending his examination by the Civil Service Commission, not to exceed 60 days, at a salary of \$25.00 per month, beginning May 1st, 1913.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Council grant the request of the Committee to decorate Main street with flags for the May Day festival.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Mayor Todd placed in nomination for Chief of Police, the name of J. A. Matthews.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the appointment of J. A. Matthews as Chief of Police be confirmed by the Council.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, not voting.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and the appointment of J. A. Matthews as Chief of Police confirmed.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the Council adjourned.
