

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 9, 1913.

All the Commissioners having been duly notified, a special meeting of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction was held at 10 o'clock a. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Todd presiding.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

Bids for furnishing cement for Sidewalk District No. 1 were received, opened and read, the same being as follows:

The United States Portland Cement Company, quoting a price of \$3.12 per barrel, sacks included, or \$2.72 per barrel net, f. o. b. cars, Grand Junction. The Colorado Portland Cement Co., quoting the same figures as the above.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the bid of the bid of the Colorado Portland Cement Co. be accepted.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bid of the Colorado Portland Cement Co. accepted.

A communication from Smith Riley, District Forester, in reference to the application of the City for a right of way for a conduit and power house on Kannah Creek for a municipal power plant, was read.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the communication was received and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Commissioner of Water and Sewers be and hereby is instructed to disconnect the sewer line that has been recently constructed in the alley in or near the Haggerty subdivision and which line empties into Sewer District No. 3, unless the owners of property abutting on said sewer line pay to the city treasurer the proportionate rate of the amount paid by property owners in Sewer District No. 3, approximately \$20.00 per lot, on or before August 20, 1913.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea; Commissioner Vedder not voting.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned.
