

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 14, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Tedd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Tedd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, at the special meeting of the City Council held August 9th, 1913, a motion was passed concerning a sewer extension in or near the Haggerty Subdivision; and

WHEREAS, it appears that the owners of five lots on which are located houses numbered respectively 926, 934 and 950 South Fourth street, the house numbered 950 being on one lot, and the other two being on two lots each, have caused at a cost in excess of one hundred dollars, a sewer to be constructed in the alley east of said lots, connecting with Sewer District No. 3, and that connections have been made with the said sewer from said lots, and no other connections have been made with said sewer extension; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the owners of said lots be permitted to use said sewer extension for said lots, and that the owners of other lots abutting on said sewer extension be refused connection with said sewer extension until they have paid to the City Treasurer for use of Sewer District No. 3, twenty dollars per lot for property to be so connected; and be it further

RESOLVED, that, so far as it conflicts with this resolution, the motion passed by this Council on August 9th, 1913, be and hereby is repealed.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that

the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:  
Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea; Todd, no.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned.
