RESOLVED, that, se far as it conflicts with this resolution, the metien passed by this Council on August 9th, 1913, be and hereby is repealed.

The metion being put, upon call of rell, the Commissioners voted as follows: Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea; Todd, no.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the metion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.
