The menthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on metion of Commissioner Verbock, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the same was referred to the Mayor.

On the petien of J. E. Lewe and others for an are light at the intersection of Tenth street and Chipeta avenue, Mayor Tedd, to whem the same had been referred, recommended that the same be granted and that the are light be placed at said point, the same to be in service on and not before April 1st.

On metien of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was accepted and ordered filed.

A communication from 0. E. Stacy, submitting an offer to do the grease trap cleaning and garbage collection for the city, was read.

On metion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the communication was laid on the table until next meeting of the Council.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, Active steps are being taken by certain citizens of Mesa Co. to divide Mesa county and embedy about 1/6 portion of said county into a new county to be named Ammens county, and

Whereas, A bill to make such a division of Mesa county is new before the Legislature, and has already been reported out favorably by the Committee on State and County Lines, and

Whereas, It is the sense of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that such a division of Mesa county would be a serious injury to all the people of Mesa county, and would prove a serious obstacle in the development and building up of our section of the State of Colorado; be it therefore

RESOLVED, By the City Council of the City of Grand Junction assembled

in regular session . that it is the sense of this Council that a massmeeting be called by the Directors of the Grand Junction Chamber of Cemmerce of all the people of Mesa County interested, for the purpose of taking such steps as may seem best to prevent the passage of such county division bill by the House and Senate of the State of Colorado: and be it further

RESOLVED. That a copy of these resolutions be placed in the hands of the Secretary of said Chamber of Commerce to be communicated by him to the said Beard of Directors, and that a copy be also sent to our Representative in Denver, the Hen. A. C. Newton.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the reselution as read be passed and adopted.

The metien being put, upon call of rell, the Commissioners veted as fellows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayer declared the metien carried and the resolution passed and adopted.
