

Grand Junction, Colorado, February 7, 1913.

All the Commissioners having been duly notified by the Mayor, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in special session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Helmburg.

The following resolution passed by the Grand Junction Chamber of Commerce was presented and read to the Council:

WHEREAS, The Chamber of Commerce is unable to carry on its most effective work by reason of a lack of funds, and

WHEREAS, The people of the City of Grand Junction have raised by tax levy a fund to be devoted to advertising and similar purposes, which fund is now in the possession of the city treasurer of the city of Grand Junction; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Chamber of Commerce do earnestly petition the city of Grand Junction to draw a warrant on the Advertising Fund for \$100 in favor of the Grand Junction Chamber of Commerce, the same to be used to carry on the program of advertising, publicity and industrial activity outlined by the Chamber of Commerce for this year's work, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be given to the City Commissioners.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck that the request embodied in the resolution passed by the Chamber of Commerce, as read, be granted, and that the Mayor and Clerk be authorized and instructed to draw a warrant on the Advertising Fund in favor of the Grand Junction Chamber of Commerce for \$100.00, to be used for advertising and publicity purposes.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:

Tedd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the Council
adjourned.
