

Grand Junction, Colorado, February 11, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Tedd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Tedd, Vedder, Helmburg. Absent: Commissioners Verbeck and Rankin.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of February 4th and special meeting of February 7th were read and approved.

A communication from A. C. Schwenker in reference to the work of garbage collection was read, and on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the communication was ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the City Attorney be instructed to go to Colorado Springs to consult with the general attorney of the Grand Junction Electric, Gas & Manufacturing Co. in reference to the condemnation of the electric light plant of said company.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Tedd, yea; Vedder, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the Council adjourned.
