

Grand Junction, Colorado, February 18, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of February 11th were read and approved.

A communication from W. M. Downing, chairman of Mountain Park committee, Denver, in reference to House Bill No. 467 now before the State Legislature, was read.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the communication was received and ordered filed.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and the bills allowed.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Amending Section 40 of Ordinance No. 178, entitled 'An Ordinance Providing for the Creation of Local Improvement Districts, the Construction therein of certain Local Improvements, and Providing a Method of Payment Therefor,' passed and adopted the 11th day of June, 1910," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the proposed

Ordinance as read be passed for publication. The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that O. G. Ceen be allowed an additional amount of \$8.00 in full settlement of claim for labor on Kannah Creek pipe line and for damages of all kinds to date.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be instructed to have the insurance on the City Hall building re-written so as to cover the new addition thereto, also to have an additional \$1,000 insurance written on the furniture and office fixtures, and an insurance of \$1,000 on the city barn and horses.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

WHEREAS, a bill has been prepared and introduced in the Legislature of the State of Colorado (known as House Bill No. 467) for the purpose of aiding and facilitating cities of this State in the acquisition of lands for parks, pleasure grounds, parkways and boulevards, and the maintenance, policing and control thereof, and

WHEREAS, it appears to this Council that the enactment of said bill into law would be beneficial to all cities of the State in promoting the establishment of parks and attractive places of recreation, as well as good roads, within our State; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, that we officially endorse said House Bill No. 467, and urge its early passage by the Legislature now in session, and be it further

RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be sent to our representative at Denver, the Hon. A. C. Newton, and to our senator, Hon. George Stephan, with the request that they do all in their power to secure the passage of said measure.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned.
