

Grand Junction, Colorado, February 25, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of February 18th were read and approved.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the Commissioner of Water and Sewers be authorized and instructed to construct a cut-over in sewer from First and Main streets to alley on Spruce and Main streets, about 550 feet, for the purpose of relieving the sewer between Main street and Reed avenue.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that S. J. Scovill be appointed City Scavenger at a salary of \$130.00 per month for man and team, beginning March 1st, 1913.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and S. J. Scovill duly appointed as City Scavenger.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the Council adjourned.
