

Grand Junction, Colorado, January 17, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 4 o'clock p. m., with Commissioner Vedder, acting Mayor, in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg. Absent: Mayer Todd.

The petition of the Fair Building Co. and others in reference to water spouts wasting and emptying into the sewers contrary to ordinance, was presented and read. On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

The quarterly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, accepted and ordered placed on file.



The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Public Affairs was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was referred to the auditor.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Highways was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the report was referred to the auditor.

Mayer Todd now reported present and took the chair.

The annual report of the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was referred to the auditor.

The annual report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The annual report of the Commissioner of Highways was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the same was referred to the auditor.

The annual report of the Commissioner of Public Affairs was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was referred to the auditor.

RESOLVED, that the Clerk be instructed to send a copy of this resolution to His Excellency E. M. Ammons, Governor of the State of Colorado.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the Council adjourned.
