

Grand Junction, Colorado, January 28, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeek, Rankin, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 14th, adjourned session of January 17th, and regular meeting of January 21st, were read and approved.

The petition of J. E. Lowe and others, asking the Council to place an arc light at the intersection of Tenth street and Chipeta avenue, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the petition was referred to the Mayor.

The petition of R. A. Howell, W. H. Hammentree, and others, asking the Council to arrange for sale of improvement district bonds to construct sidewalks on Main street, Colorado avenue, and other streets and avenues as mentioned in petition, was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the petition be granted, and that the City Attorney be instructed to take such action as may be necessary to carry out the legal requirements of the petition. The motion carried.

A communication from S. G. McMullin, general attorney of the Grand Junction Electric, Gas & Manufacturing Co., in reference to the payment of water rental by said company, was read. On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the communication was ordered filed.

A communication from Frank Thompson, submitting proposition to take a census of the city for \$125.00, was read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the communication was ordered filed.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The annual report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the report was referred to the auditor.

The annual report of the City Clerk and Auditor was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

Mayor Todd submitted to the Council the appointment of A. P. Creeks as driver of the Fire Auto, in place of A. G. Lenardson, resigned.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the appointment of A. P. Creeks to the position of Driver of the Fire Auto be confirmed by the Council.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and the appointment confirmed.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Clerk be instructed to have annual reports of Commissioners printed in pamphlet form.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the Council adjourned.
