

Grand Junction, Colorado, July 22, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of July 15th and adjourned sessions of July 16th and 17th were read and approved.

A communication from Dr. G. B. Stone, making application for a permit to erect an illuminated sign, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the communication was referred to the Mayor and Clerk, with power to act in the matter of granting the permit to erect sign.

The quarterly report of the City Health Officer was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Public Affairs was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was referred to the Auditor.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers was submitted and read, and the same was, on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, referred to the Auditor.
