Grand Junetien, Celerado, June 10, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 e'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

The fellewing Cemmissieners, upon call of rell, responded as present: Tedd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Helmburg.

City Atterney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 3d were read approved.

The petition of A. F. Platz and others, asking that the sewer be extended from the south line of the Denver & Rie Grande Railread in alley between Fourth and Fifth streets south to the outlet of Sewer District No. 3, was presented and read.

On metien of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

The petition of Henry Frank and others, asking the Council to order a cement sidewalk laid on the north side of Block 39, was presented and read.

Meved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the following resolution be passed and adopted:

WHEREAS, Henry Frank and ethers have petitioned for a cement sidewalk to be laid on the north side of Block 39, and

WHEREAS, the Council deems that the construction of said sidewalk is necessary; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that a cement sidewalk be and hereby is erdered constructed in accordance with the previsions of the city ordinance on the north side of Bock 39 of the City of Grand Junction; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the City Clerk be and hereby is authorized and instructed to notify the ewners of the lets fronting on the north side of said Block 39 to construct a coment sidewalk in front of their respective premises within thirty (30) days after the receipt of said notice.

The metion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners veted as follows:
Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayer declared the resolution passed and adopted, and the sidewalk ordered constructed.

The bill of A. West for \$72.00, for 25 days labor cleaning grease traps and alleys having been approved and audited, it was moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the same be allowed and a warrant ordered drawn on the Health fund for the amount.

The metien being put, each Commissioner as his name was called veted as fellows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having veted yea, the Mayer declared the metion carried and the bill allowed.

Meved by Cemmissioner Verbeck, seconded by Cemmissioner Vedder, that the City Atterney be instructed to prepare an ordinance imposing a license on clairveyants, palmists and fortune tellors.

The motion carried.

On metion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the Council adjourned.
