

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 17th, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeek, Rankin, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 10th were read and approved.

The report of the City Weigher for the month of May having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeek, accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Clerk be instructed to request H. Goodman, junk dealer, to appear before the Council at its next meeting and show cause why his license should not be revoked for failure to comply with the city ordinance in relation to junk dealers.

The motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance in Relation to Licenses," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, it appears from the records that this Council granted the minimum rate of \$11.50 per annum to several water users on Orchard Mesa for the reason that said water users had their water faucets half mile or more from their house, and

WHEREAS, it appears that water user H. R. Wilcox has his faucet half mile or more from his house; be it, therefore,

RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be instructed to make said H. R. Wilcox's water rate the minimum rate of \$11.50 per annum.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Mayor and the Commissioner of Highways be appointed a special committee to investigate the matter of procuring places for hitching farmers' teams.

The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the Council adjourned until Saturday June 21, at 4 o'clock p. m.
