

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 24, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Helmburg.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 17th and adjourned session of June 21st were read and approved.

The petition of F. A. White and others, asking that a six-inch water main be laid on North avenue from North Seventh street to Twelfth street, and that are lights be placed at the corner of North avenue and Ninth street, also at the corner of North avenue and Twelfth street, was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that, since it is impossible to grant the request of the petitioners on account of the lack of funds, the petition be not granted.

The motion carried.

Mr. A. Goodman having been summoned to appear before the Council to explain why his license as junk dealer should not be revoked, appeared and made explanation and made promise to strictly comply with the provisions of the ordinance in reference to junk dealers hereafter.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The bond of John A. Matthews as Chief of Police having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, accepted and ordered placed on file.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the Council adjourned until to-morrow, June 25th, at 11 o'clock a. m.
