

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 25th, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 11 o'clock a. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The following bids for the bonds of Sidewalk District No. 1 were received and read:

Wm. E. Sweet & Co., offering ninety-five fifty.
James N. Wright & Co., offering par, less one hundred dollars.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the bid of James N. Wright & Co. for the bonds of Sidewalk District No. 1 be accepted.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the Daily Sentinel be designated as the official paper of the city for the six months beginning July 1st and ending December 31st, 1913.

The substitute motion made by Commissioner Verbeck and seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the two daily papers of the city be requested to submit bids for the city printing and advertising having been put and lost, the original motion was put, and each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea; Todd, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the Daily Sentinel designated as the official paper of the city for the period named.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the Council adjourned.
