A communication from Wm. E. Sweet & Co., of Denver, in reference to their contract for option on the \$21,000 of bonds of Paving District No. 3, and stating that they would exercise said option, was read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be instructed to write Wm. E. Sweet & Co. and inform them that all preliminary proceedings relating to the formation of the said Paving District No. 3 have been taken and the bonds printed, and to hotify said firm #3,000 of at once and the balance that, the bonds of said paving district will be issued, on or about June 1st, 1913.
