

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 6th, 1913.

A special joint meeting of the County Commissioners of Mesa county and the City Commissioners of the City of Grand Junction was held at 3 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Tedd presiding, the meeting having been called to consider the matter of the dedication of two lots in Block 54, City of Grand Junction, for an armory, and

the claim of the State thereto. The following Commissioners were present: County Commissioners Snyder, Thompson and Briggs, and City Commissioners Todd, Verbeck, Verbeck, Rankin and Holmberg.

On motion of County Commissioner Snyder, seconded by City Commissioner Verbeck, a joint committee of four, two County Commissioners, and two City Commissioners, were appointed to take up the matter and make a proposition to the State, namely: County Commissioners Snyder and Thompson, and City Commissioners Tedd and Verbeck.

The joint meeting then adjourned.
