

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 13, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Rankin.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 29th, special meeting of May 6th, and regular meeting of May 6th were read and approved.

The petition of the Ridley-Stiles Optical Co., making application for permission to erect an illuminated sign at 120 North Fifth street, was presented and read. On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the petition was referred to the Mayor and Clerk, with power to act.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 206, passed and adopted the third day of December, 1912, entitled 'An Ordinance in Relation to Water Rents' ", was presented and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried, and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the proposed ordinance and entitled "An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 206, passed and adopted the third day of December, 1912, entitled 'An Ordinance in Relation to Water Rents' " be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 209.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Licenses," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.



On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned until *Monday*, May 19, at 4 o'clock p. m.
